Welcome back to Erindale for the 50th Anniversary Reunion

In November 1967, the ground was broken on what was to become Erindale Secondary School. The building was officially opened by the Minister of Education William Davis (who later became Premier) in December 1968 at which time the student population of 900 and staff of 55 began to build the enviable reputation that Erindale has been well known for throughout its history.

The building itself needed a major addition to accommodate the growing community, and in the 1980s, when the school population swelled to over 2300, portable classrooms lined the football and baseball fields with a 'six pack' attached to the music area. In 2016, the International Baccalaureate (IB) program was added to the school curriculum. Currently there are 730 students at Erindale.

Through all of the change over 50 years, the fine tradition of academic excellence, athletic achievement, and active involvement in the arts and clubs continues to be upheld by the Raider staff and students of today.

The reunion committee would like to welcome each of you back-to-school where we hope you will be able to reunite and reminisce with your fellow students and teachers. We hope you have a happy time! Erindale has always shared a special spirit amongst its collective residents, staff and students combined, to make it a treasured place in our minds and hearts.

Thank you to our principal and administration, students, alumni, and staff who have been working so diligently to organize this event. Mostly though, thanks to you, Raiders past and present, who have come back to share in the 50th celebration.
